7. Information

- Magazine

Issue 2011D saw the launch of the Association's celebrations of the Austin Seven's first production at Warwick School in July 2012 with an Entry Form, Colour Advert and Outline Programme – NOTE: The Accommodation List is attached to these Minutes (Att. 4)

Action: All to promote this major event and encourage participation.

- Magazine Distribution

Les confirmed that the distribution system was now generally working smoothly and seemed to suit all concerned.

Action: All to alert Les (copy to Ian) of any changes in mag numbers needed or in delivery address. Les also wanted to remind members that Howard dealt with 'Back Issues' and that the last date for changing numbers wanted is the Friday before each meeting.

- Magazine Back Numbers

Howard reported he still maintained a limited number of each year's Back Numbers.

Howard also said that in view of increasing overall demand, the total number of Magazines printed each issue is being increased to 4200.

Meeting gave a really big vote of thanks to Robin, Les and Howard for maintaining the un-equalled quality of our mag and ensuring it reaches our members so easily and efficiently.

- Advertising - Hazel reported advertising continued to go well and, for the period to Oct. 2011, it is expected to realise £1592.

Hazel asked the Meeting if it was necessary to increase the Association's Advertising Rates.

Meeting considered that the rates were currently about right but asked Hazel to do some 'rounding up'. It was considered that the present ratio of advertising to content in the Magazine is about right and that the offer of some free-space to Clubs should be maintained.

The revised advertising rates are at Attachment 4.

8. Archives

Phil reported

- Sales: Four packages in the last 3 months, cheques sent to Treasurer totalling £119.16.
- Handbooks: No new purchases/gifts etc in the last 3 months however a colleague was attending the Cheltenham auction the day before with bids on several lots - Post Meeting- outbid on all- nil result!
- The Austin Films: The 4 previous VHS tapes have been looked at and only one – ‘This Progress’ - is still on sale at Gaydon as a DVD for £19.99. We have established competitive repro costs at sale around £6 each but the question of copyright must be resolved on paper before anything is done.

Action: Ian to confirm copyright situation

- Stanley Edge drawings: When Toby Wilson of Bonhams valued the Waite trophies and then these for us Mon 10th May 2010 he commented they were in poor condition.

The mid-1970s Somerset Archives work was now 35 years old and deteriorating.

One had already been done but the other 9 have now been taken to Leicester Record Office at Wigston where they will be professionally re-encapsulated. Estimated £201.96. Their fuller report has been provided for the magazine. Meeting approved this expenditure

- Three repro brochures for 2012: These have now been selected, early Ruby, Vans, and Ulster. Two are with the printers for estimates, the third is being made available. Quantities of 500 each is suggested.

- Stock posters: ‘Chummy in the Lane’ and ‘Specials’ are available in satisfactory quantities, ‘Longbridge Bodies’ will need another run.

- Archive Open Weekend: Sat-Sun 3-4 December 2011 10am to 4pm – All Welcome!

9. Support

- **Red Cross Guide** - David Waller was continuing to check all entries for validity and hoped to complete for 2012.

- **Breakdown Register** - Gordon reported that the new Register has been well received.

- **Chassis Register** - Ian reported that Sandy was working hard on the production of the new Register for 2012. With the A7OC not able to quote, it is suggested that Dave Wilcox and Alan Garaghty assist Sandy with printing possibly still in the A5 format. Hayden confirmed that he was in touch with Sandy and ready to take over at next year’s AGM.

11. AOB

a. Peter Butler ‘Le Mans’ Speedy

Members will recall the heroic efforts of Peter Butler and his team in so successfully entering his wonderful ‘Austin 7 Speedy’ at Le Mans in 2010 and his generosity at showing it at our AGM and Lubenham, where our President Bob Wyatt presented him with the richly-deserved Ray Morley Award. Peter has also kindly offered to show the Speedy at our 90th Anniversary Celebration in Warwick 2012, which is just following Le Mans 2012.

Peter again wishes to enter the car at Le Mans in 2012 where Entry Fees and transport costs are estimated to amount to some £9000 with entrants paying their own expenses. Peter explained the details of his 2012 Entry (see Attachment 6) to the meeting and requested support from the Association for the Le Mans Entry Fee - 4,950 Euros.

Meeting discussed the matter at length elected to take the proposal in two steps:

1. To agree in principle to support Peter Butler’s A7 Speedy Entry at Le Mans 2012.

Proposed: Scottish A7 Club Seconded: the PWA7C Committee

Meeting agreed the proposal unanimously

2. To support Peter Butler’s A7 Speedy Entry at Le Mans 2012 by paying the Le Mans Entry Fee of 4,950 Euros.

Proposed: Howard Annett A7OC Seconded: Hayden Morgan ScA7C

Meeting agreed the proposal unanimously.

Bernard Cowley, Chairman, underlined that this sponsorship represented a unique occasion for the Austin 7 movement and therefore should not be seen as establishing a precedent for the Association and the occasion should be used to promote the Association in every way possible, including prominent display of the A7CA logo.

Meeting wished Peter and his team every success at Le Mans and looked forward to seeing the Speedy next year at our 90th Anniversary Celebrations in Warwick. Peter thanked the Association for their support and its great generosity. He confirmed that he will continue to actively undertake further financial support from interested Clubs and Companies – and in the event of a surplus for the

endeavour that any surplus would be returned to the Association. He also agreed to write an article for the Association magazine on the project.

b. The A7CA as a 'Company Limited By Guarantee' - Attachment 7

Many major motoring Clubs and Associations have decided, for a variety of reason, to register as a 'Company Limited by Guarantee' for example the A7OC and the 750MC. The rationale for this is somewhat complex and John Wyett has kindly prepared a short paper setting out the 'pros' and 'cons' for this move with a view to making a firm proposal – one way or the other – at our 2012 AGM for action in due course if agreed.



Attachment 6: Peter Butler's 'Le Mans' Speedy – CZ 6324

1. CZ 6324 ran in 1935 and again in 2010. She was successful on both occasions - she won the <750 cc's Class in 1935. I have been in touch with the organisers who have indicated they would love to welcome her for a Third time.
2. Andy Storer, who organised everything so well in 2010, is back on board - as are the whole team from last time. A number of them are on time constraints due to the number of Anniversaries next year. However, in discussion with those affected nothing has clashed so much that a way cannot be found through, given goodwill on all sides.
3. The preparation would be different to last time, both in the reduced amount required and the much greater time available to do it. In essence, it amounts to rear axle rebuild, gearbox inspection, and engine "refresh" - dismantling and re-assembly.
4. In addition to the basic costs of this work, Andy would like to see covered 2 x Ferries (because we take a spare car with us - not itself eligible, of course - but a useful source for fuel pump, starter motor, etc.last time it saved the whole attempt) plus passenger tickets for the team, insurance, and petrol to get to/from Le Mans, and for the race itself (the organisers operate a very lucrative monopoly!).
5. Andy Storer thinks that a maximum of £5,000 would cover all this, but I have asked to look again at this figure, to see whether it could be reduced.
6. In addition, there are substantial Entry Fees which for 2012 are set at 4,950 Euro's if paid before 15 December 2011 (5,450 Euros thereafter)
- 7.1 Speedy is available: I confirm this. David Wilcox has been using her during the Season.
- 7.2 The Team from last time have all confirmed their interest in doing it again, and to carry their own expenses again, apart from Ferries.
8. She can come straight back and on to Warwick to take part in the 90th Celebrations!
9. In support of the above I am seeking Sponsorship. Last time Pre-War Austin Seven Club and 750 Motor Club each gave £500 toward the costs: this was gratefully received.
However, on this occasion I have to ask for very much more than this, or else it cannot go ahead, which would be a pity. My own resources were exhausted by the rebuild costs, my income is very limited - I suffered a severe Stroke several years ago. Nonetheless, I will put in £1,000 of my own money.
10. This, then, is the Proposal. I'm sorry that it cannot be exact at this stage, but you will get the outline.
11. Obviously, I would be delighted to see all the balance of costs underwritten; however, we do live in the real world.

Attachment 7: A7CA as Company Limited by Guarantee

- Information Paper by John Wyett October 2011

Introduction

Most of the major Austin Seven Clubs who are members of A7CA are already incorporated as Companies Limited by Guarantee.

This briefing note seeks to inform members of the 'pros and cons' of incorporation and to seek authority to move towards incorporating the Association as a Company Limited by Guarantee (CLG).

What is a company limited by guarantee?

- A private limited company where the liability of members is limited to a nominal amount in the event that the company is wound up.
- A CLG does not have share capital unlike other forms of limited company.
- The members of a CLG are guarantors rather than shareholders.
- The guarantee is a nominal sum (typically £1) which is payable in the event of winding up.
- The amount of the guarantee is stated in the constitution of the company (which is known as its Memorandum and Articles of Association).

What are the features of a CLG and why form a CLG?

- A CLG is a useful vehicle for operating a not for profit organisation.
- Any profits made by a CLG are not distributed as dividends but are retained within the company in order to aid the fulfilment of the company objectives.
- If the CLG enters into contracts the idea of limited liability may be useful for the members as a form of protection against claims against the company.
- CLG status gives the organisation a clear legal identity, the CLG can own property in its own right and participants/members are afforded protection of company law.
- The directors (trustees) of the company enjoy personal limited liability afforded by limited liability status, provided that they have not exceeded their legal responsibilities and have not acted negligently or fraudulently.

Constitution

All limited liability companies must have a written constitution known as its “memorandum and articles of association”, in practice most small companies adopt “model” constitutions from company law. The choice of a model constitution can be particularly important if the company is also seeking charitable status as its constitution must then be acceptable to the Charity Commission. (I think it is unlikely that A7CA would be seeking charitable status?).

The memorandum sets out the objectives of the company and powers of the company necessary to meet these objectives.

The Articles of Association basically set out the rules for operating the company e.g.

- Frequency of meetings
- Voting rights of members
- Resolutions
- Procedure for appointment and retirement of members and directors.
- Remuneration of directors by expenses.

What are the advantages and disadvantages of incorporation as a CLG?

Advantages

- Protection afforded by limited liability.
- Ability to own property and enter into contracts in its own right.
- Clarification of the identity of the CLG.
- Open and democratic structure.

Disadvantages

- Record keeping and bureaucracy.
- Expenses of company formation and annual returns to Companies House.
- Proper accounting records needed, accounting filing regulations to be met.
- Privacy: details of the CLG are open for public inspection.
- Status of associate clubs, overseas clubs and registers as members of a CLG unknown?

Audit

Small companies need not have an annual audit if they are eligible for exemption. A7CA would be a small company but (I believe) should still have an annual audit.

Taxation

The profits of any trading activities between the A7CA and non-members of the Association are liable to corporation tax (and also any investment income of A7CA). At the moment, there are no material such profits which could trigger an

unwelcome corporation tax liability. The tax status of the Association as a CLG would not change significantly .

Actions:

1. **Seek approval of Member Clubs to pursue incorporation as The Austin Seven Clubs Association Ltd (a Company Limited by Guarantee).**
